

Recycling Your Printer & Toner Cartridges

- Age Concern, Cancer Research, Help The Aged, Oxfam, Scope will all take back printer and toner cartridges for recycling.
- Environmental Business Products Ltd collect empty printer / toner cartridges from all over the UK and recycle them, raising funds for a few different charities. One such charity to donate to is Tommy's Baby Charity, to donate, please phone 0800 435 576 or visit www.inkagain.co.uk for details.
- Lasertech recycles cartridges and a percentage of the money raised from doing so can be donated to one of the charities currently working with the company; NCH, Breakthrough Breast Cancer and the Prince's Trust. Lasertech will provide either large or small collection bins, free of charge, and collect them free of charge once full.
- Recycle 4 Charity provides boxes and bags to collect both cartridges and mobile phones for re-conditioning and recycling. Money raised is donated to various charities. For more details on setting up a collection or to donate visit [Recycle 4 Charity](#).
- Some of the organisations listed will also provide collection boxes for larger numbers of cartridges - often providing a free collection service. If you are a school or a business - give them a call to find out more.

The following companies offer a postal return or free collection service:

- Greensource Solutions: 0117 304 2390 will send you Freepost bags for you to return inkjet cartridges, for larger laser cartridges please contact in advance to arrange collection
- LaserLife: 020 8960 1233 - collection service, minimum 10
- AFIC: 01782 578029 will supply Freepost bags but these are quite large and would need would need at least ten laser cartridges so may be suitable for you to take into your place of work
- Emptycartridge: 01908 609763, email: information@emptycartridge.co.uk - free collection service for schools, charitable organizations, businesses and individuals. Save them and earn money for your charity, school or your business.

These companies will reink/remanufacture the cartridges and you will be able to buy these back at a lower price than for new cartridges. They will generally accept all electronic consumables such as toner and fax cartridges and typewriter ribbons.

- British Red Cross Inkjet Appeal - you can send your inkjet cartridges to Used Inkjet appeal, Freepost NATE223, Newmarket, CB8 7BR.
- CLIC (Caring for Cancer and Leukaemia In Childhood) - can recycle laser toner and inkjet cartridges through their recycling partner Environmental Business Products (EBP): -Click on www.eachonecounts.co.uk and register to check the recyclability of your cartridge. They can also provide freepost envelopes for inkjet cartridges, call 01173148623 for more details.
- RNIB - provide a freepost envelope for small items and collect larger quantities or laser cartridges free of charge. 50% of the money raised from the cartridges goes to the charity to help people with sight problems.
