

Recycling Your Unwanted Mobile Phones

CRUMP - The Campaign to Recycle Unwanted Mobile Phones helps the environment and children in hospitals worldwide. It is run by Child Advocacy International. If you have at least 10 mobile phones please phone 01283 516259 to arrange a collection. If you have just 1 or 2 phones simply post them to us at FREEPOST CRUMP.

Recycling Appeal - allows you to recycle your mobile phone and donate the money raised from the mobile phone to a charity of your choice. This could be anything from SCOPE to Macmillan Cancer Relief to Football Aid and many more. For more information please call 08451 30 20 10.

[Brent Lodge](#) in West Sussex is a bird and wildlife hospital dedicated to the treatment, rehabilitation and release of injured wild birds and small mammals. You can send old mobile telephones in to be recycled, by sending in your old phone to be recycled, Brent Lodge will get 50% of all recycling revenue gained.

The Fonebak Scheme:

Shields Environmental have created a nationwide reuse and recycling scheme. Customers can either return unwanted phone handsets and accessories directly to O2, Orange, T-Mobile and Vodafone outlets, or collect Freepost envelopes for the return of materials at Orange, Virgin Mobile, Virgin Megastores, Dixons, The Link and PC World stores. Phones are then assessed for re-use or recycling. Some will be sold to developing countries while others will be broken down and disposed of safely.

Tesco stores have a scheme to recycle old mobile telephones. Ask for a freepost envelope in order to send off the mobile. A small percentage of the phones are re-used in developing countries and others, which are broken or too old, are sent to France for recycling, for more information please click [here](#).

Argos stores are now handing out Freepost recycling envelopes to enable customers to recycle their old mobiles for free whilst helping to raise money for the charity.

Comet has a mobile phone recycling scheme in partnership with mobile phone recycler XS Tronix. Customers can pick up a free pre-paid envelope from Comet, place their old phone in it and send it to XS Tronix. They then either choose for Comet to donate up to £5 to Macmillan Cancer Relief, or receive a £5 reduction off the price of a new phone.
