

CRAWLEY COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP PLAN 2008-2011

2010-2011 ACTION PLAN

Priority 1: Reduce alcohol and drug-related crime, particularly public place violence and vandalism (Lead partner: Sussex Police)

- 1.1 Ensure compliance with the licensing law, including mandatory conditions
- 1.2 Promote alcohol and drug awareness initiatives and campaigns
- 1.3 Achieve the Safer Socialising Award for Crawley Town Centre
- 1.4 Pilot a drug arrest referral service in the Crawley Custody Centre

Priority 2: Reduce acquisitive crimes of most concern to local communities, including burglary, robbery, vehicle crime and crimes against businesses (Lead partner: Sussex Police)

- 2.1 Undertake targeted activity in hotspot locations to reduce serious crime, particularly burglary, vehicle theft, robbery and criminal damage.
- 2.2 Extend Crawley ShopWatch to the neighbourhood shopping parades.

Priority 3: Reduce re-offending by those who commit the most crime or cause the most harm (Lead partner: Surrey and Sussex Probation Trust)

- 3.1 Develop further the Integrated Offender Management arrangements to target offenders who present the highest risk of re-offending

Priority 4: Reduce fear of crime and promote public confidence (Lead partner: Crawley Borough Council)

- 4.1 Tell residents what is being done to make Crawley safer.
- 4.2 Increase the number of public-place CCTV cameras in use in Crawley.
- 4.3 Develop further the partnership's approach to e-communication.
- 4.4 Make safety and environmental improvements in vulnerable areas.
- 4.5 Deliver a Safer Crawley Events Programme.

Priority 5: Support children and young people to be safe and feel safe (Lead partner: Crawley Borough Council)

- 5.1 Provide a targeted, responsive programme of positive activities that meet the needs of children and young people.
- 5.2 Work with young people to build and preserve their positive image in Crawley.
- 5.3 Develop a coordinated local youth policy for older children and teenagers.

Priority 6: Tackle anti-social behaviour (ASB), particularly involving young people (Lead partner: Crawley Borough Council)

- 6.1 With Crawley Homes, develop a Family Intervention Project to work with families to prevent their anti-social behaviour and to sustain their tenancies.
- 6.2 With Crawley Homes, develop new arrangements to deal with serious and complex tenant-related anti-social behaviour and domestic violence.
- 6.3 Provide an outreach service to adult street drinkers in Crawley.
- 6.4 Develop further 'B-Boyz', Firebreak and other youth-related initiatives.
- 6.5 Publish a minimum set of standards for dealing with anti-social behaviour.
- 6.6 Support the victims and witnesses of anti-social behaviour.

- 6.7 Develop more restorative approaches to tackle local anti-social behaviour
- 6.8 Evaluate the ASB youth caseworker post and make recommendations.
- 6.9 Undertake a campaign to tackle the anti-social use of quad bikes, mini-motos and off-road motorcycles.
- 6.10 Evaluate the use of the Designated Public Places Order to tackle alcohol-related anti-social behaviour and make recommendations.
- 6.11 Tackle environmental anti-social behaviour including graffiti, fires started deliberately, litter and abandoned vehicles.

Priority 7: Tackle domestic abuse, serious sexual offences and hate crime
(Lead partner: West Sussex County Council)

- 7.1 Make referrals into the voluntary sector to provide support to the survivors of domestic abuse.
- 7.2 Establish a drop-in centre in Crawley to encourage more members of BME communities to report cases of hate crime/incidents.
- 7.3 Implement the recommendations of the BME domestic violence report.
- 7.4 Provide training for agencies on the Multi-Agency Risk Assessment Conference (MARAC) arrangements for victims of domestic violence.
- 7.5 Establish a multi agency pilot project to deal with high-risk cases of hate crime in Crawley.

Priority 8: Reduce road deaths and serious injuries
(Lead partner: West Sussex Fire & Rescue Service)

- 8.1 Undertake projects targeting vulnerable road users aged 10 (year 6).
- 8.2 Undertake projects targeting vulnerable road users aged 11-16.
- 8.3 Undertake projects targeting vulnerable road users aged 17 – 24.
- 8.4 Undertake projects targeting people in cars aged 11-16.
- 8.5 Undertake projects targeting people in cars aged 17 – 24.
- 8.6 Undertake projects targeting people in cars of all ages.
- 8.7 Undertake projects specifically targeting older drivers.
- 8.8 Undertake projects targeting young male moped riders.
- 8.9 Undertake projects targeting motorbike riders.

The Safer Crawley Partnership is working with Sussex Police to achieve the following reduction targets in 2010/11
